TERMS AND CONDITIONS

2025

The 'HIRMINA PRIZE' (hereinafter referred to as the 'PRIZE') is an international initiative to recognise and provide support, and visibility to organisations, projects and initiatives related to the further development of education for sustainability.

We strongly believe that education is the angular stone of social development to promote sustainable communities.

The 'HIRMINA PRIZE' aims to stimulate small positive changes. We want a better world for the generations to come.

Our efforts are aligned with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, The Agenda 2030.

The PRIZE is developed and executed jointly by The FuturED Institute and The Global Education for Sustainability Foundation (THE ORGANISERS). Both organisations are deeply committed to promote the access to higher education and sustainable development worldwide.

By participating, applicants expressly accept all the terms and conditions established in this document, as well as in any other attached documents.

The organisations, projects and initiatives recognised need to meet the following criteria:

THE PRIZE

- The winner will receive a trophy and diploma during the III International Gala "Education for Sustainability". The event will take place on Friday 7 November 2025, 19.00, at the Caledonian Club, Belgravia, London. (<https://gloaledgala.org/>)
- An optional support programme (The PROGRAMME). This programme includes the production of educational masterclasses both in English and Spanish, pedagogical support in academic design, mentoring and networking opportunities, connection with experts and industry leaders and other activities that allow them to incubate, scale or accelerate the project/initiative.

METHODOLOGY AND DATES

The PRIZE will be carried out through several stages, as follows:

- Evaluation of projects and initiatives proposed;
- Selection of FINALISTS;
- Selection of WINNER.

The dates for the PRIZE are the following:

- 5 September 2025. Submission deadline.
- 3 October 2025. Shortlisted Organisations, Projects, and Initiatives Announcement.
- 7 November 2025. The ‘HIRMINA PRIZE’ Winner will be announced during the International Gala “Education for Sustainability”, that will take place next Friday 7 November 2025, at the Caledonian Club, in London, United Kingdom. (gloaledgala.org)

PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

- Organisations, projects, and initiatives considered by this recognition must intent to be working or presently developing in either Ibero-America, Latin America, South America, Central America, or the Caribbean.
- Should be inclusive and sustainable and contribute to an equitable society.



- Should have a positive and long-lasting impact on participants and their community. All initiatives need to be able to develop monitoring indicators in order to keep track of the progresses achieved.

EVALUATION CRITERIA

- EDUCATION FOR SUSTAINABILITY: Must promote education and sustainability;
- SOCIAL IMPACT: Must have an evident potential to generate social impact;
- SCALABILITY: Should be possible to replicate in other communities/regions/countries;
- INNOVATION: Original proposals are highly encouraged;
- INCLUSIVITY: Projects must encourage equality and fair social representativity.

DATA PROTECTION

Organisations, projects, and initiatives considered by this recognition accept that any information entered for the PRIZE will be considered either as public information or private information. Private Information will be considered the information which only THE ORGANISERS will have access with the purpose of evaluating the applications and projects.

In any case THE ORGANISERS shall not share any personal data with any third party without the applicant's approval.

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

Organisations, projects, and initiatives considered by this recognition accept to declare and guarantee that any intellectual property used during their participation in the PRIZE is of their own property or that they have the necessary licenses or permissions to use it. All joint work, development or creation generated by the applicant with the ORGANISERS during their participation in the PRIZE shall belong to the applicant, except when intellectual property of the ORGANISERS is or was used on said work, development, or creation.

USE OF DISTINCTIVE SIGNS

All titles, rights and interests established in the platform, website and related documentation are the exclusive property of the ORGANISERS and/or third-party partners. The ORGANISERS will authorize applicants to use the distinctive sign HIRMINA PRIZE to promote their participation in the PRIZE during the reception of applicant's projects and initiatives until the selection of FINALISTS period, and only to the FINALISTS and WINNER during the selection of FINALIST and selection of WINNER period.

The use of the distinctive sign HIRMINA PRIZE will be subject to the ORGANISERS trademark guidelines and policy. The WINNER of the PRIZE may use the distinctive sign HIRMINA PRIZE for their commercial activity or as a certification mark. All applicants agree that their participation in the PRIZE does not grant them any sort of license or assignment to any distinctive signs or trademarks of the ORGANISERS, except is expressly granted in writing by ORGANISERS.

DISCLAIMERS

Any recommendations, advising or assistance delivered by ORGANISERS as part of the PROGRAM will not be considered a consultancy service. In this relation, applicants acknowledge and declare that any recommendations, advising and/or assistance delivered by ORGANISERS as part of the Program will not guarantee or represent in any way the success of the applicant's project. ORGANISERS will provide recommendations, advising or assistance upon its own discretion, and nothing in these terms and conditions shall be construed meaning that ORGANISERS will be forced or obliged to provide such recommendations, advising or assistance upon the applicants discretion and/or request. No statement by the ORGANISERS shall be interpreted as binding with respect to selection for FINALISTS and WINNER, except for those made by the ORGANISERS in the pertinent selection of FINALISTS and WINNER.

If necessary, the ORGANISERS reserves the right to make changes to these terms and conditions without prior notice and need of consent from the applicants.



In case the applicant provides and/or delivers inaccurate information and/or documents, or provides false statements to the ORGANISERS, applicant shall be liable for any misrepresentation, damage or any consequence resulting from the use of such information/documents/statements by ORGANISERS.

The ORGANISERS reserves the right to choose the FINALISTS and the WINNER at its own discretion, upon the evaluation criteria, and its decision shall be final and not be subject to appeal and/or complaint.
